Advised? You weren't "advised" of the emails back and forth - you were copied in to them because you are repeatedly inserting yourself into what should be a simple and honest process! Our arguments for reasonable production of documents have been rebuffed at every turn and we continue to endure lies, denials and massive overcharges. Attached is the email thread that shows some more of the obfuscation we have been dealing with. We will be in at 1:00 to collect the records, including the *still* altered count sheet, flash drive and short stack of emails. We will sign in at the computer, and under protest, document and pay for the records. This, after the last stack of financial records, which has not been provided in full (including inter and intra departmental transfers and vendor balance reports/similar, which supposedly do not exist), cost over \$3100/ \$310 per inch, were negligently and compromisingly redacted, some of which were manufactured for our request, and many of which were simply printed from the computer.

Why do these records matter so much to you?! When you were at the financial records pickup, sighing, I angrily told you "accountability starts at the top." You responded "I agree." Maybe you should start showing it.
